Screening	VS	Diagnostic
Annual exam for women 40+ with no symptoms of breast cancer.	WHO SHOULD GET THIS?	For women experiencing symptoms or to follow up on an abnormal screening. For women who have completed treatment for breast cancer within 2 years. Diagnostic mammograms can continue annually after the 2 years.
A breast X-ray that uses low-dose radiation to create an image of your breast tissue. This exam looks for signs of breast cancer when a person is not having any symptoms.	WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?	A breast x-ray which looks more closely into symptoms such as a lump, pain, etc. Also used for follow up imaging after receiving treatment.
Results are available usually within 3-5 business days.	WHEN CAN I EXPECT THE RESULTS?	Results are available at the time of the appointment.
Additional testing, if needed, is scheduled for a separate appointment.	WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS?	A radiologist will review the imaging at the time of the exam and determine if additional testing is needed.
Most insurance plans cover the cost.	WHAT IS THE COST?	Costs are dependent on your benefit plan. Please contact your insurance company to determine your coverage details.
