



Breast Screening Mammogram

Screening	vs	Diagnostic
Annual exam for women 40+ with no symptoms of breast cancer.	<p>WHO SHOULD GET THIS?</p>	For women experiencing symptoms or to follow up on an abnormal screening. For women who have completed treatment for breast cancer within 2 years. Diagnostic mammograms can continue annually after the 2 years.
A breast X-ray that uses low-dose radiation to create an image of your breast tissue. This exam looks for signs of breast cancer when a person is not having any symptoms.	<p>WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?</p>	A breast x-ray which looks more closely into symptoms such as a lump, pain, etc. Also used for follow up imaging after receiving treatment.
Results are available usually within 3-5 business days.	<p>WHEN CAN I EXPECT THE RESULTS?</p>	Results are available at the time of the appointment.
Additional testing, if needed, is scheduled for a separate appointment.	<p>WHAT ARE THE NEXT STEPS?</p>	A radiologist will review the imaging at the time of the exam and determine if additional testing is needed.
Most insurance plans cover the cost.	<p>WHAT IS THE COST?</p>	Costs are dependent on your benefit plan. Please contact your insurance company to determine your coverage details.
